Despite lower bull prices in BC this last spring, the sales overall of purebred and commercial Hereford cattle have remained strong in Canada and demand for good Hereford cattle continues to increase as we are the only true outcross source. Hopefully this strong trend will continue in 2018-2019. Watch for Hereford sales this fall with the Richardson Ranch online sale and Bull sales next spring at Pine Butte, Dawson Creek, Vanderhoof and Williams Lake.

Your BC Board continued to address issues that arrive through the year. We questioned the use of aerosols in fitting animals and communicated our concerns with the new Hereford Plus Program with the CHA. We conducted a survey among members about the feasibility of holding a Hereford sale in BC. The response to the survey indicated that, at this time, there is not enough interest among members to make it viable. Many of us are anxiously awaiting the arrival of the Certified Hereford Beef Program in Canada as we believe this will begin to reward our commercial customers who continue to produce F1 Hereford calves when they sell them. It is time to put the "credit where the credit is due".
